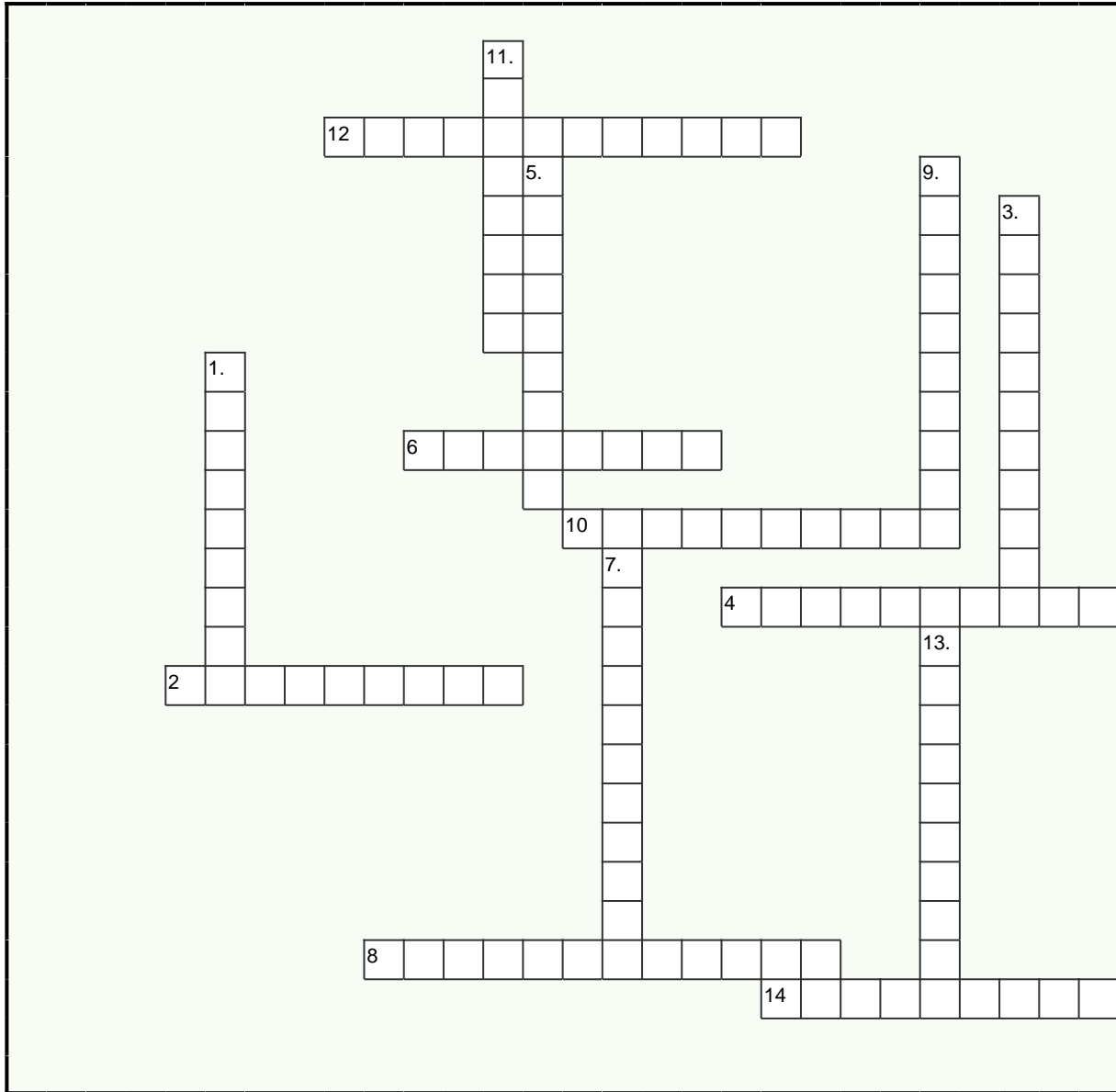


Crossword Puzzle

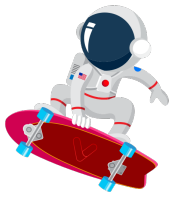
